Thiopentone 3-5mg/kg (up to 350mg)	
Suxamethonium 1-1.5mg/kg (70-100mg)	
Has are are are a divised division	
Has emergency drugs drawn	
Glycopyyrolate Meteraminol	
Ensures monitoring including capnography Intubation – with bougie if necessary	
Never takes longer than 30 seconds – if fails back	
to BVM before repeating	
Checks tube position	
Patient to go to ITU	
Tationt to go to 110
