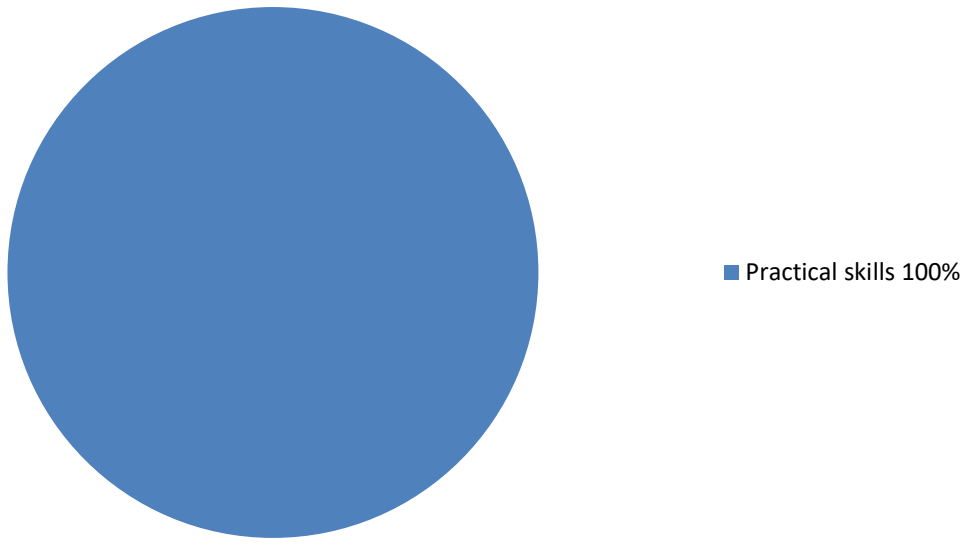


Marking



A 50 year old male has come in with an obstructed airway. He is presumed to be drunk

Washed hands	
Appropriate airway manoeuvres	
Check for FB	
Suction	
Oxygen	
Airway manoeuvres	
Nasopharyngeal airway adjunct - sizing and placement	
Reassess	
Oropharyngeal airway adjunct – sizing and placement	
Reassess	
Correct mask size	
BVM ventilation	
Decision for RSI and call for help	
Pre-oxygenation	
Equipment check Plan – A Plan – B Plan – C	
Drugs with doses – based on 70kg adult <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3-2-1 ? • 3mcg/kg fentanyl (210mcg) • 2mg/kg ketamine (140mg) • 1mg/kg rocuronium (70mg) Or standard RSI <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Thiopentone 3-5mg/kg (up to 350mg) • Suxamethonium 1-1.5mg/kg (70-100mg) Has emergency drugs drawn Glycopyrrolate Meteraminol	
Ensures monitoring including capnography	
Intubation – with bougie if necessary	
Never takes longer than 30 seconds – if fails back to BVM before repeating	
Checks tube position	
Patient to go to ITU
