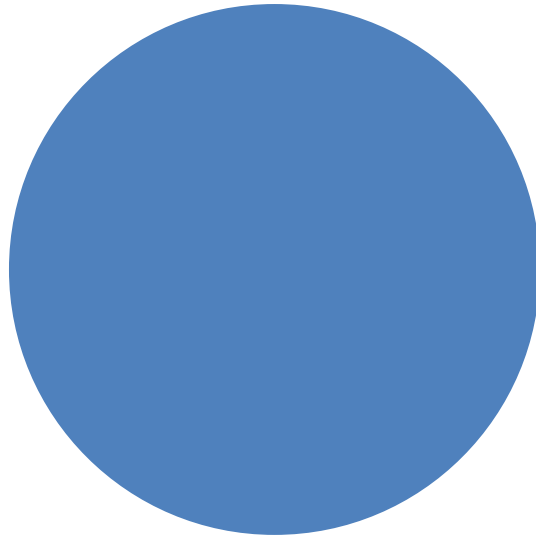


Marking



■ Examination 100%

Perform Cardiovascular examination

Washed hands	
Introduces self	
Checks patient identity	
Obtains verbal consent for examination	
Ask if patient requires any pain relief prior to starting	
Offers to help undress patient	
Inspection from end of bed	
Hand inspection <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Peripipheral cyanosis • Clubbing • Koilonychia 	
Radial pulses – check both sides and examines for collapsing pulse	
Enquires about blood pressure	
Face – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conjunctival pallor • Xanthelasma • Looks for central cyanosis 	
Neck <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • JVP • Carotid pulse (ear lob movement suggest forceful pulse , Corrigan's sign and may suggest AR) 	
Precordium examination <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heaves/thrills • Apex beat • Check for PPM 	
Auscultate <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aortic – sit patient forward • Pulmonary • Tricuspid • Mitral – rotate patient onto their left side • Lung bases 	
RILE	
Offer to assist the patient redressing	
Tell the examiner that you would like to examine peripheral pulses, and see an ECG	
Thanks patient	
Asks if patient has any questions	
Correctly summarises	
Patient mark
